CFAN is located approximately 2 hours northeast of Albuquerque, New Mexico. Their mission is to serve the Navajo Nation Indians through service and ministry.

Mission:

What to Expect:

Lybrook is located in the high desert and conditions can be quite extreme. Please check your weather App for weekly highs/lows. The climate is VERY dry, and often very breezy. Winter months can bring extreme cold, high winds, snow, and rain. The terrain is VERY sandy; which turns to mud in the winter and dry/dusty in the summer. CFAN is 5 miles from the nearest convenience/gas station, so it's best to come with all necessities. Although rarely seen, venomous snakes do roam the terrain in the warm months. The mission has no WIFI available, be prepared to use cellular. There are no TV's.

What to Bring:

Sleeping bags/pillows

Reusable Water Bottle (Yeti)

Chap stick/Lotion/Eye drops (Dry climate year round)/Sunscreen/Bug spray

Special Dietary needs

Medicines/pain relief/allergy medications/Epi pens, etc.

Closed toe shoes/boots (SUMMER: cowboy/hiking boots WINTER: Snow/Rain/Hiking)

Camera/Mobile phone/External charger/Charging cords

CASH – the Navajo make/sell crafts, bring cash to purchase a Navajo Souvenirs

Clothing: (Think Dusty)

Winter: (Highs 40°F /Lows in the teens, but lows can be below 0°F, and windy)

Fleece/Snow Jacket/Windproof

Hats/Gloves

Warm boots/Waterproof boots/Hiking boots

Long sleeve shirts/Fleece/Jeans/Warm sweatpants

Summer: (Highs in 90's °F, Lows mid 50°F) – can get into low 100's.

Leggings/Jeans/Hiking Shorts/long pants/Khakis/Capris

Hiking boots/Tennis Shoes/Cowboy boots

Jacket/sweater (cool evenings)

Tshirts (short and long)

Hats (sun visors)
